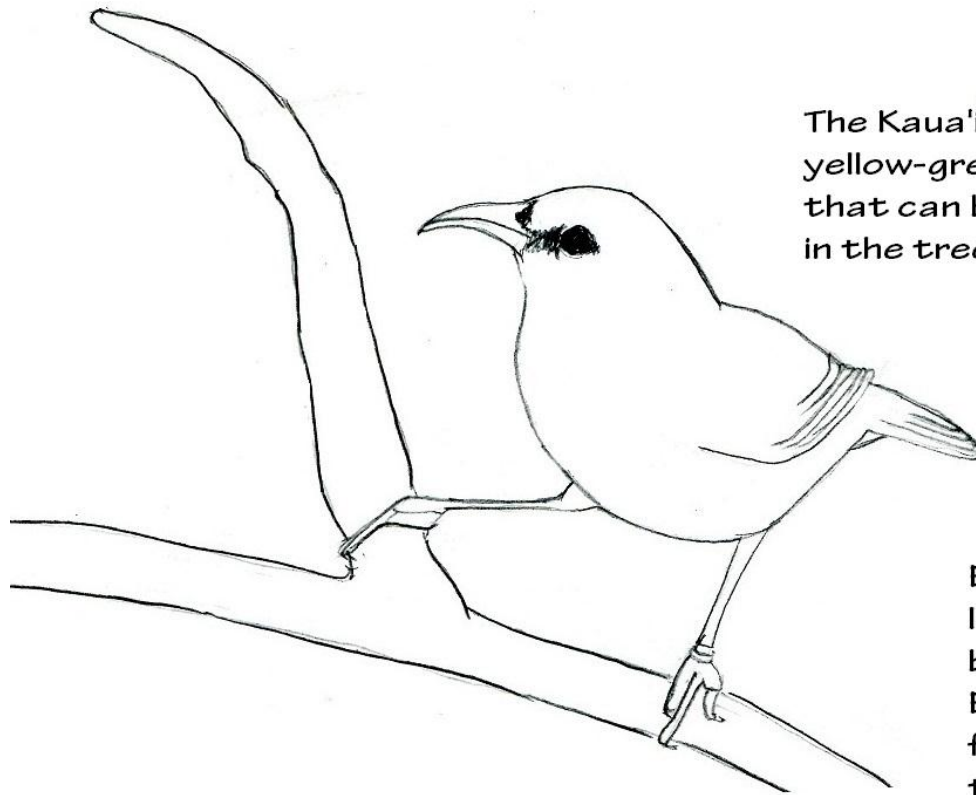

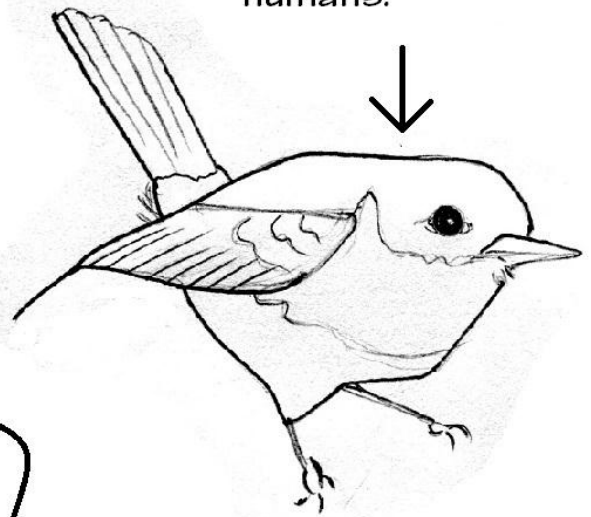

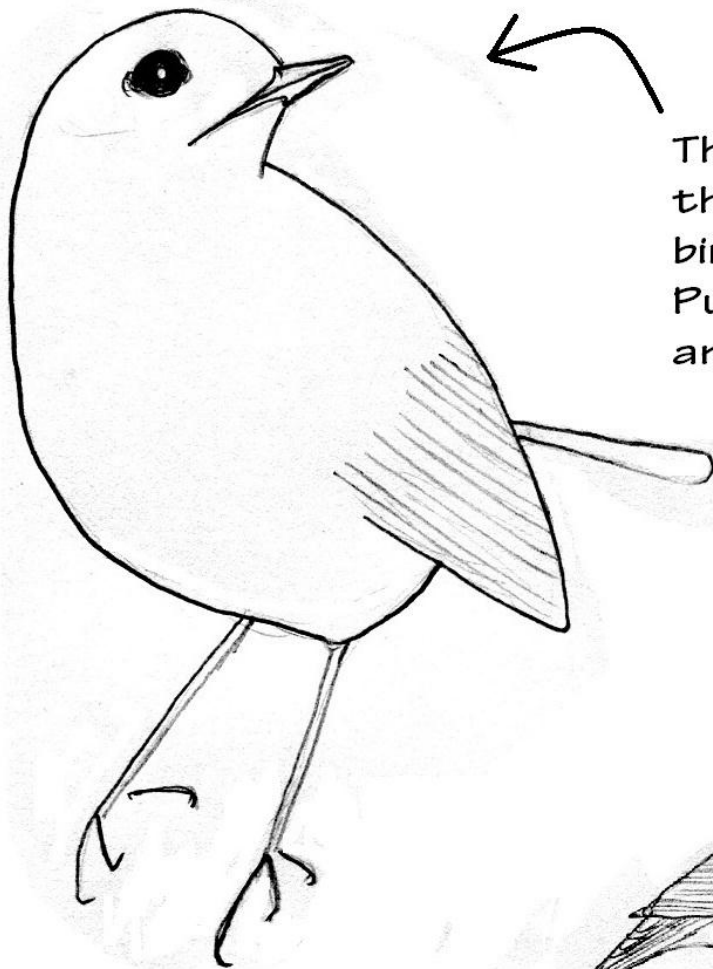
The Kaua'i Amakihi is a large yellow-green nectar-eating bird that can be heard calling loudly in the treetops.



Elepaio is the loudest friendliest bird in the forest. Elepaio catches flies and moths in the air and is very curious around humans.

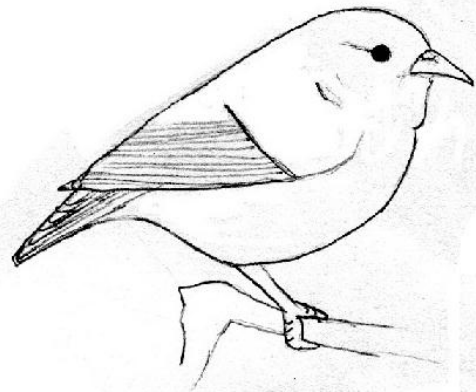


The Akeke'e is a very rare and secretive bird found only in the Alaka'i wilderness. Akeke'e pries open flowers and leaves in search of bugs to eat.

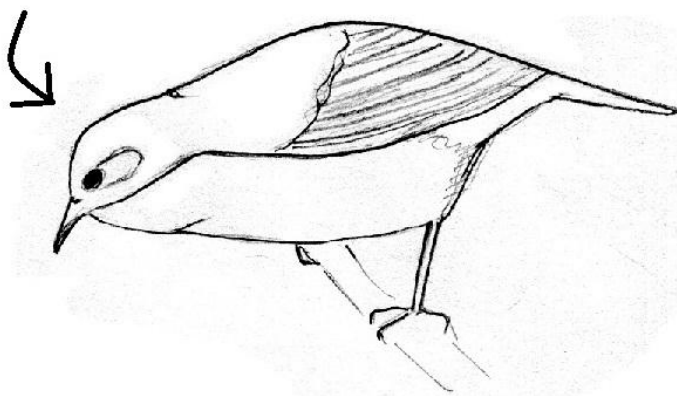

The rare Puaiohi is the biggest native bird in the forest. Puaiohi eats fruit and berries.

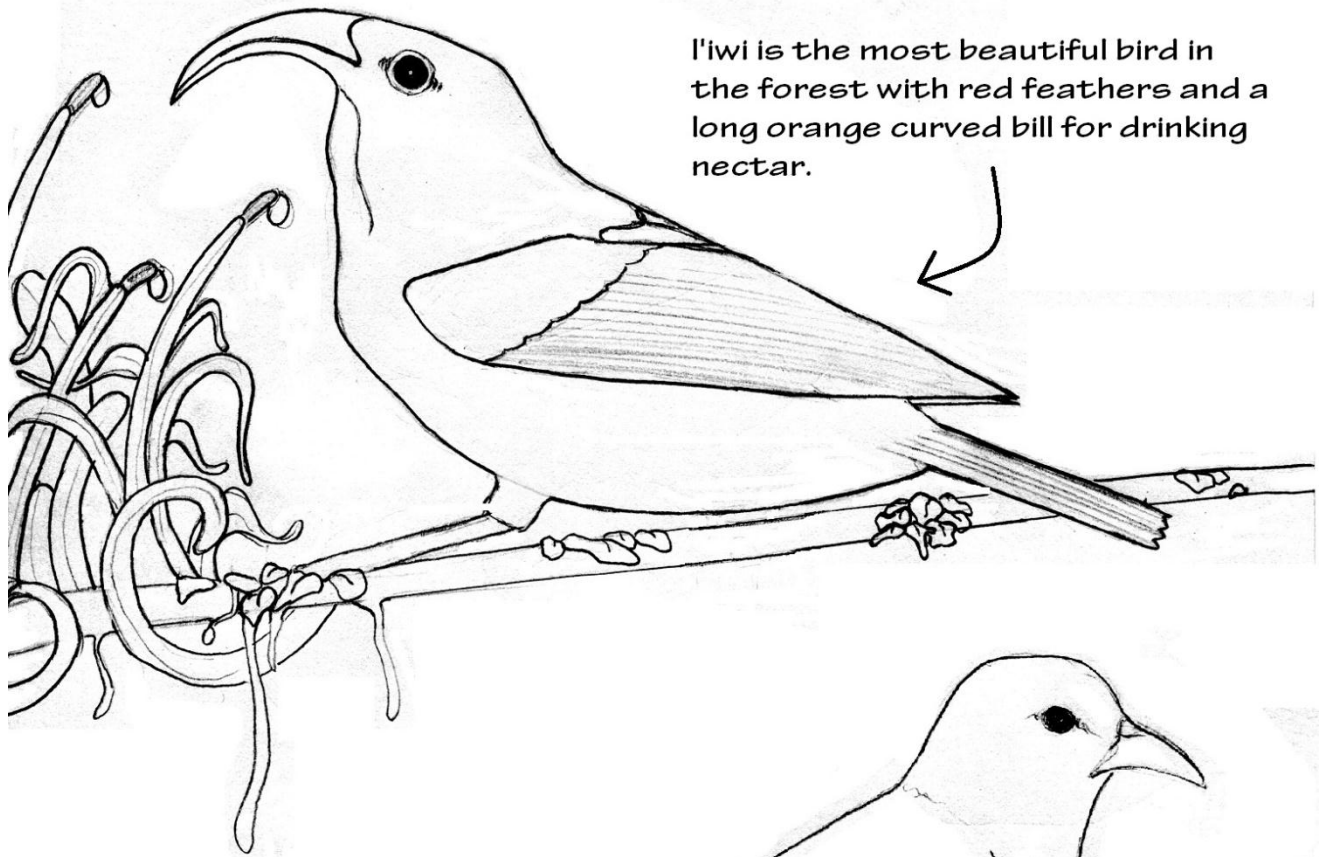


Akikiki pokes around tree bark looking for insects while calling softly to its friends.

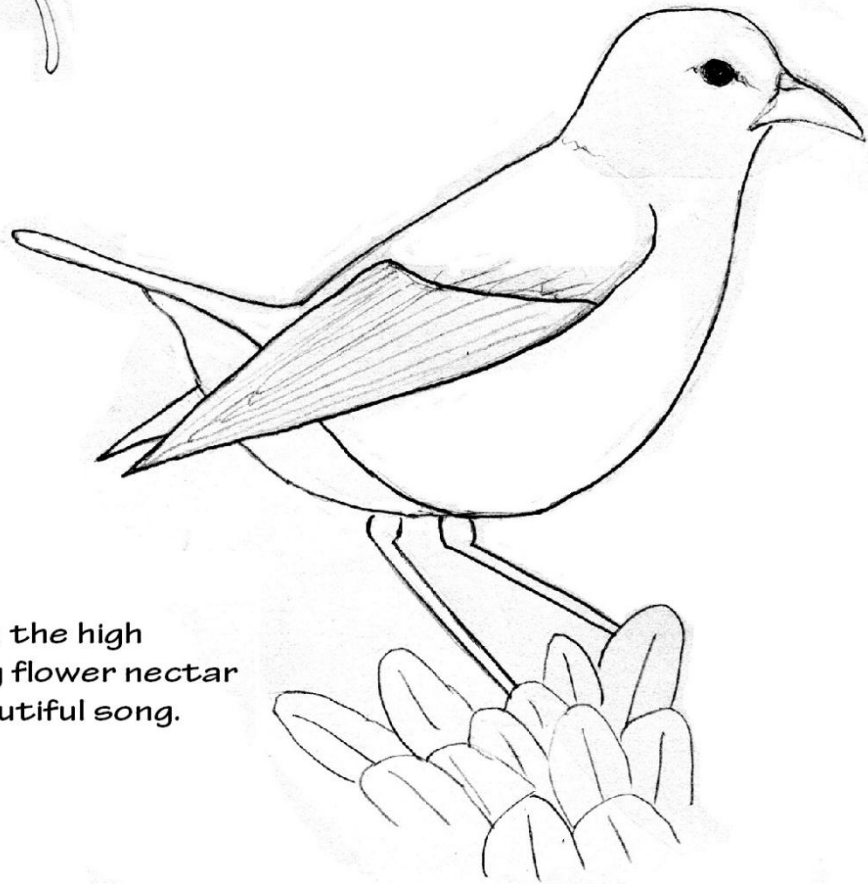
